Born in Belarus, Anatoli Sivko studied at the Belarusian State Music Academy and was a member of the Dutch National Opera Studio from 2010–11. Anatoli is the recipient of highly acclaimed awards at the prestigious International Francisco Viñas singing competition (1st Prize - 2015) the Neue Stimmen Competition (1st Prize - 2016).

Recent highlights include house debuts at Wiener Staatsoper in *Il barbiere di Siviglia* and *Don Giovanni*, Royal Opera House Covent Garden as Masetto in *Don Giovanni*, Glyndebourne Touring Opera as Don Basilio in *Il barbiere di Siviglia*, Naples Opera, Florida, as Escamillo in *Carmen*, Bayerische Staatsoper for *Un ballo in maschera* as well as concert performances under Vasily Petrenko with the Netherlands Radio Philharmonic at Amsterdam's Concertgebouw as well as Berliner Philharmoniker in Berlin and Baden-Baden.
